The new Business Consumer Services and Housing Agency (BCSHA) opened its doors for the first time on July 1st, carrying out Governor Brown's government reorganization plan. The new agency is responsible for licensing and oversight of industries, businesses and certain professionals. The Governor's reorganization plan was unanimously approved by the Little Hoover Commission in May 2012 and

the Legislature the following month. As a result of these changes, BCSHA now consists of eight departments, boards and commissions. The following entities now fall under BCSHA:

- Department of Consumer Affairs
- Department of Fair Employment and Housing
- Department of Housing and Community Development
- Department of Business Oversight (previously The Department of Corporations and The Department of Financial Institutions)
- Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control
- The Alcohol Beverage Control Appeals Board
- The California Horse Racing Board
- The Alfred E. Alquist Seismic Safety Commission

The reorganization shifts the following government operation entities of the former State and Consumer Services Agency (SCSA) into the newly created Government Operations Agency:

- The Department of General Services
- CalPERS
- CalSTRS
- The Franchise Tax Board
- The Victims Compensation and Government Claims Board

The plan shifts the following California historical entities of the former SCSA into the Natural Resources Agency:

- California African American Museum
- California Science Center
- Exposition Park
