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Section 5: Qualitative Assessment

1. Describe how HEAP funds have contributed to your Continuum of Care making progress towards local homeless goals (e.g. additional services provided, capacity created, systems building, investments made, lower waitlists, etc.)

City HEAP funds have primarily contributed to the goal of reducing unsheltered homelessness in our community. During the reporting period, HEAP funds have allowed the City to increase its capacity to deliver critical services to the unsheltered population by expanding the City's shelter capacity by 100 year round beds, or 365,000 bed nights; the creation of three Community Cabins sites (navigation centers) that collectively provide 154 beds or 56210 bed nights along with housing navigation and other wrap around services; and the creation of an RV Safe Parking site that provides 45 parking spaces (serving approximately 90 people) with electricity, drinking water, 24 hour security. In addition to ending unsheltered homelessness, the HEAP funds have been used to improve health and hygeine for people who remain unsheltered. Funding has covered the expansion of mobile hygiene services to include mobile showers and laundry service at ten encampment sites; and the addition of 1 FTE Outreach worker whose focus is to work with entire encampments on health and safety issues.

2. Describe how HEAP funds have contributed to your Continuum of Care making progress towards local youth homelessness goals (e.g. additional services provided, capacity created, systems building, investments made, lower waitlist, etc.)

The youth-set aside will allow the City to expand its capacity to serve transitional aged youths in emergency shelter. The funds will be used to partially support the capital costs of expanding an existing youth shelter by 30 beds, or 10,950 bed nights. While these funds were not expended during the reporting period, the funds have been obligated and the City anticipates the additional capacity coming online within the next 12 months.

3. Describe the alignment between HEAP-funded activities and "Housing First" principles (as defined in Welfare and Institutions Code section 8255).

All HEAP funded activities and programs are aligned with "Housing First" principles. The emergency shelter, Community Cabins and Safe Parking programs are extremely low barrier for entry and accept clients without preconditions including those with active substance use, criminal backgrounds, lack of income, and those who are experiencing mental health symptoms. The City ensures that all its HEAP funded programs employ a housing first model and that low-barrier standards are adhered to by all service providers.

4. Please provide any additional feedback on the impact of HEAP funds that you would like to share with the Homeless Coordinating and Financing Council. (Optional)

The uniqueness of this program has contributed to its success in Oakland. The simple application, rapid allocation of funds, flexibility of use, and direct allocation to the City all contributed to our success in getting these funds immediately into action and addressing the crisis of un sheltered homelessness in our community. The impact of HEAP funding cannot be overstated. The funding has significantly bolstered the City's ability to mitigate the negative impact of the housing and homeless crisis in Oakland, especially the impact of unsheltered homelessness. HEAP funding will ultimately allow the City to operate 5 navigation centers, 3 safe parking sites, increase mobile health and hygiene services, provide encampment focused outreach, , and expand the City's capacity to provide shelter to transitional aged youths.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:

Program agreements are signed by participants at the City's Navigation Centers and Safe Parking Sites and participants are assigned a bed/space until the participant eixts the program, therefore, "number of instances of services" are not calculated by these interventions, which is noted as "N/A" in Section 3. Additionally, the City hired an Outreach Worker to coordinate outreach efforts with outreach organziations the City contracts with and to work with entire encampments around maintaining their health and safety. Individual outreach contacts were not tracked.
