1. Describe how HEAP funds have contributed to your Continuum of Care making progress towards local homeless goals (e.g. additional services provided, capacity created, systems building, investments made, lower waitlists, etc.)

The City of San José coordinated with the County of Santa Clara, serving as the Continuum of Care Collaborative applicant, to align programming and resources for the HEAP funds using the strategies outlined in the five-year Community Plan to End Homelessness. The City of San José focused on the Plan's strategy to "serve the person" by developing different responses for different levels of need. HEAP allowed the City of San José to create and expand opportunities to address the large unsheltered population.

In developing the contracts during the reporting period, the City of San José focused on using HEAP funds to enhance systems that work in the community, including homelessness prevention and crisis response interventions, as well as create new programs from strategies that have been successful elsewhere. However, the next reporting period will reflect the impact the funds have made through the progress towards local homelessness goals in San José and Santa Clara County.

2. Describe how HEAP funds have contributed to your Continuum of Care making progress towards local youth homelessness goals (e.g. additional services provided, capacity created, systems building, investments made, lower waitlist, etc.)

The City of San José focused on the Community Plan to End Homelessness's strategy to "serve the person" by developing unique approaches for unique populations. HEAP allowed the City of San José to structure housing and services to meet the needs of young people experiencing homelessness.

During the report time period, the City of San José had obligated \$1 million in HEAP funds for rental subsidies and supportive services for homeless youth. However, the next reporting period will reflect the progress and impact of the funds on the homeless youth population in San José.

3. Describe the alignment between HEAP-funded activities and "Housing First" principles (as defined in Welfare and Institutions Code section 8255).

All the contracts in which programs are funded with HEAP include language in regard to being in compliance with the core components of Housing First, as defined in Welfare and Institutions Code Section 8255(b). This is reflected in the Santa Clara County Continuum of Care Quality Assurance Standards for Homeless Housing and Services Programs.

All member agencies of the Santa Clara County Collaborative on Affordable Housing and Homeless Issues (CoC) use the Quality Assurance Standards as a benchmark and model for agency- and program-level policies and procedures. Included in all contracts, the City of San José uses the Quality Assurance Standards to assess agency and program capacity, operations, and performance.

The Quality Assurance Standards are guided by "Housing First" principles. Agencies and programs, including those funded by HEAP, are encouraged to adopt a low-barrier, housing first approach in their written policies and procedures, by limiting the grounds for expulsion from the program as much as is reasonably possible. Further, Permanent housing programs, including permanent supportive housing and rapid rehousing, and transitional housing programs will fill spaces in their programs from a community queue (coordinated Assessment system) of eligible households generated from the Homeless Management Information System.

4. Please provide any additional feedback on the impact of HEAP funds that you would like to share with the Homeless Coordinating and Financing Council. (Optional)

Prior to obligating HEAP funds, the City of San José sought feedback from multiple sources, including homeless individuals, t o develop an expenditure plan. On November 8, 2018, staff discussed the HEAP grant and proposed a preliminary expenditure plan to a City Council Committee. The Committee recommended that the City prioritize HEAP spending on essential services and temporary shelter opportunities and prioritize programs that could quickly accommodate the greatest number of participants to meet the urgent need of San José's unsheltered population. On November 27, 2018, the City Council approved the proposed expenditure plan for HEAP.

With no angoing or dedicated funding for amergency carvices and cricis interventions, such as mobile chawers, amergency shelter hads, or safe parking, the City of San Jose has limited ability to offer these types of critical services

with no ongoing or dedicated funding for emergency services and crisis interventions, such as mobile snowers, emergency sneiter beds, or safe parking, the City of san Jose has limited ability to offer these types of critical services. The HEAP funding provided this flexible funding to respond to urgent needs.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:

Sections 3 and 4 were intentionally left blank in this reporting period as the only expenditures were for construction of the new Bridge Housing Communities (tiny homes) site, which will offer interim housing for homeless individuals with housing subsidies who are actively searching for housing.

By the end of December 2019, 100% of the HEAP funds had been obligated, with the exception of the interest earned, and at least 95% of the funds had executed contracts.
