# Section 5: Qualitative Assessment

1. Describe how HEAP funds have contributed to your Continuum of Care making progress towards local homeless goals (e.g. additional services provided, capacity created, systems building, investments made, lower waitlists, etc.)

During this report period, HEAP funds have contributed to the progress toward local homeless goals for our CoC by: 1) Creating 19 family dwellings to transitionally house homeless families, which resulted in the removal of 19 families from the Coordinated Entry list. 2) Providing the down payment for the purchase of a mobile clinic to assist persons with chronic conditions and medicine management, which is expected to be operational in January 2020. 3) Funding the purchase of a duplex to house transitional age youth expected to take occupancy in January 2020. 4) Funding the ongoing operations of a day shelter providing services to 537 unduplicated individuals. 5) Funding services to prevent families from entering the homeless population by providing rental assistance, arrears payments for rent or utilities, and other financial assistance to reduce barriers to obtaining and/or maintaining housing.

2. Describe how HEAP funds have contributed to your Continuum of Care making progress towards local youth homelessness goals (e.g. additional services provided, capacity created, systems building, investments made, lower waitlist, etc.)

During this report period, HEAP funds have contributed to the progress toward local youth homeless goals by funding the purchase of a duplex to house transitional age youth expected to take occupancy in January 2020. All tennants will have access to support services including educational advocacy, employment readiness training, development of independent living skills, mental and physical health services, and other support services.

Upon award from the CoC, each HEAP funded project recipient signed an Affirmation of Compliance to Housing First, affirming any housing related activities funded with HEAP funds, including but not limited to, emergency shelter, rapid rehousing, rental assistance, transitional housing and permanent supportive housing will be in compliance or otherwise aligned with the Core Components of Housing First, pursuant to Welfare and Institution Code Section 8255(b). All contracts between the Administrative Entity (AE) and the HEAP subgrantees state that services provided by the Contractor shall be in alignment with Housing First principles. In addition, upon the start of each HEAP funded program, the AE and CoC jointly conducted 30, 60, and 90 day on site monitoring visits. During these visits, case files were reviewed to ensure written documents such as rental agreements and case plans were consistent with Housing First language and practice. Where there was language or practice inconsistencies with Housing First principles, technical assistance was provided to the service provider to bring such documents into compliance with the core components and policies of Housing First.

# 4. Please provide any additional feedback on the impact of HEAP funds that you would like to share with the Homeless Coordinating and Financing Council. (Optional)

The HEAP grant has enabled homeless and housing service providers to make incredible strides in helping vulnerable families who previously were without housing, and without any reasonable prospects for obtaining housing. New rental houses and apartments have been made available, moving men, women and children out of homelessness. Once placed in transitional housing, support services to help families work through the issues that have kept them from obtaining or retaining housing in the past are provided. Through rental subsidies and case management services funded by HEAP, every family, to the extent possible, receives all the assistance they need to move toward self sufficiency. Embracing housing first principals has provided new housing opportunities for clients who may not have qualified for traditional housing programs.

# **ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:**

1) The first reporting period was a learning experience for the HEAP sub-grantees in regards to claiming reimbursement for HEAP program expenditures. Several claims for services provided during the report period were not received by the AE to process for payment until after September 30, 2019, and therefore are not reflected in the expenditure portion of this report. The AE is working closely with all HEAP sub-grantees to ensure timely submittal of claims for reimbursement for HEAP funded programs. 2) Funding for HMIS start up and training for new HEAP recipents would have been helpful. A signifigant amount of time has been dedicated to HMIS agency onboarding and training.
