Describe how HEAP funds have contributed to your Continuum of Care making progress towards local homeless goals (e.g. additional services provided, capacity created, systems building, investments made, lower waitlists, etc.)
 The Glendale Continuum of Care has (4) sub-recipients of HEAP funding that support homeless services in the community through outreact

The Glendale Continuum of Care has (4) sub-recipients of HEAP funding that support homeless services in the community through outreach, homeless prevention, hospital discharge planning, and youth services. Ascencia homeless outreach program responds to the ongoing needs of literally (recently) and chronically (longer-term) homeless people in the City of Glendale. According to the 2019 homeless count, there was a 6.5% decrease from 260 in 2018, to 243 persons experiencing homelessness in Glendale. This, in conjunction with the collaboration with other community agencies and organizations in the City of Glendale's Continuum of Care, indicates that the strategy being utilized to reduce, and ultimately end, homelessness is demonstrating success. Ascencia outreach team is dedicated to helping our homeless neighbors find housing. The homeless prevention provider Catholic Charities has assisted families with rental or utility assistance. The families serve are allowed to focus on continuing their life goals by eliminating the stress of becoming homeless. The youth service provider Glendale Youth Alliance has been in the community for over 27 years providing serving such as employment assistance, job training and most recently with the funding from HEAP motel vouchers for youth age 16 - 24, some who are experiencing homelessness. Glendale Youth Alliance is impacted by the homeless crisis and the number of homeless youth is increasing. A new partner to the continuum is Adventist Glendale Hospital which has HEAP funding to provide a dedicated staff person to provide personalized navigation services for homeless inpatients and outpatients with complex care needs to connect them with services such as mental health, housing, specialty care, and other vital resources.

HEAP funds have allowed the youth service provider Glendale Youth Alliance to expand their	capacity to support the TAY population with

3. Describe the alignment between HEAP-funded activities and "Housing Fir	st" principles (as defined in Welfare and Institutions Code section 8255).
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The Glendale Continuum of Care includes guidance and training to all sub-recipients on the "Housing First" principles. The outreach service provider Ascencia is very familiar with the "Housing First" model and as an agency employs the model to all programs within their agency. Ascencia uses a client-centered "whatever it takes" approach to ensure housing is not only obtained first but that the client's stability in permanent housing is met. Ascencia approach is implemented in a five-stage process; (1) outreach and engagement, (2) assessment, (3) short-term case management to address immediate needs, (4) housing search and placement, (5) post-placement services to help clients integrate into the new neighborhood and achieve and maintain stability. Ascencia outreach team has done exceptionally well in employing the "Housing First' model with housing placements being accomplished directly from the streets or "Street to Home".

(Optional) Client Success Story: In September 2019 - Ascencia outreach team, in collaboration with Glendale Police Department, came in contact with additional outreach team and been sleeping on a bus bench in front of a Whole Foods store in the City. While Ascencia has had much success in housing clients initially engaged through street outreach, this success story is directly afforded to the funding we received from the HEAP program. Through the addition of an additional Outreach Case Manager, was willing to be connected to help and to be reunified with family in permanent housing, reducing Glendale's homeless count
