2. Describe how HEAP funds have contributed to your Continuum of Care making progress towards local youth homelessness goals (e.g. additional services provided, capacity created, systems building, investments made, lower waitlist, etc.)

With regards to Homeless Youth, On the Move's VOICES program anticipates working towards the following goals: Improve System Navigation - Improve outreach and engagement; Reduce the number of people entering the homeless assistance system; Improve system-wide communication, collaboration, and coordination. Strengthen Support System Available to Help Residents Maintain Housing - Increase and improve access to behavioral health treatment and services; Increase and improve transportation options; Develop mechanisms to increase income for households. Progress towards these goals has been made by going out into the community and meeting organizations and youth to spread the word of VOICES and to find youth in need of services.

Collaborative efforts to date include: An in-depth assessment of community readiness involving youth and adult leaders from private and public agencies that revealed deep needs and highly motivated youth and adults. A highly effective team of community partners has formed a Steering Committee that will open doors for the Youth Founders in many ways. Youth Founders are building new partnerships with community organizations including Aldea Children and Family Services, Alternative Family Services, Housing First Solano, Resource Connect Solano, First Place for Youth, Shelter Inc., Vallejo City Unified School District and Fighting Back Partnership. Through these collaborative relationships, youth leaders hope to create opportunities for co-located services and to identify adult leaders who will be able to support them in their work to lead system-level changes.

2. Describe the alignment between HEAD funded activities and "Housing First" principles (as defined in Welfare and Institutions Code section 9255)

A collaborative comprehensive Prevention and Diversion program was developed between Community Action North Bay and SHELTER, Inc., two homelessness service providers, along with Resource Connect Solano, the local Coordinated Entry Operator. This collaboration caters to all homeless and at risk of homelessness persons' individual needs, keep clients out of homelessness and work towards self-sufficiency and permanent housing. The three organizations meet monthly to refine referral procedures, consult with each other on available funding, and anticipate upcoming client referrals. In addition, SHELTER's anticipated emergency shelter expansion project will increase the number of shelter beds provided, as well as include a new kitchen facility to feed additional homeless persons and persons at risk of homelessness, which will increase the provision of nutritious meals for those without access to food. HEAP funds also created two new youth service centers that provide homeless youth with additional learning opportunities and access to resources for homeless youth development.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:

Although HEAP service provider Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) agreements were effective as of March 15, 2019, some HEAP service providers were not able to fully execute their MOU agreements until late 2019, which resulted in delayed expenditures for HEAP program activities during this reporting period. As an example:

- Vacaville Social Services Corporation (VSSC) is in process of conducting homeless youth outreach for their homeless youth day shelter program consistent with Housing First principles, to enable low-barrier access to VSSC's day shelter and services.
- SHELTER, Inc. (SHELTER) has started assisting clients through their Prevention & Diversion program; however, expansion of the only emergency shelter in Solano County, run by SHELTER, has been delayed due to unanticipated construction costs and the need to revise the previously approved scope of work. SHELTER anticipates awarding a construction contract of \$2,700,000 and starting work to expand and improve the shelter in January of 2020.

There are also additional activities and expenditures incurred during the reporting period from October 1, 2019 - December 31, 2019. During this timeframe, youth services providers served an additional 28 clients total between the months of October & November, and spent a total of \$50,714.66 for homeless youth program-related services. Community Action Partnership Solano, JPA (CAP Solano JPA) is awaiting SHELTER's executed contract with their kitchen facility contractor.

CAP Solano JPA is on track to meet the 50% contractual obligation deadline by January 31, 2020, given the additional program activities and expenditures that are currently in progress for the remainder of 2019. Nonetheless, CAP Solano JPA is assembling a 50% contractual obligation plan and timeline to be submitted on January 31, 2020 for HCFC approval.
