## Section 5: Qualitative Assessment

1. Describe how HEAP funds have contributed to your Continuum of Care making progress towards local homeless goals (e.g. additional services provided, capacity created, systems building, investments made, lower waitlists, etc.)

Project 1: Emergency Shelter Expansion: According to the the 2019 Point In Time Count, metro Bakersfield had 643 unsheltered homeless individuals. The CoC 10 Year Plan to Address Homelessness includes the goal to, "Ensure that there are sufficient emergency shelter beds to meet the needs of homeless individuals and families, and that beds are effectively utilized." This project will increase capacity for emergency shelter beds by 40 assisting in meeting the needs of metro Bakersfield's unsheltered homless persons. The project also provides additional space for individuals who are homeless to meet with partnering service providers. Enabling service providers to come to the client rather than the individual having to travel to the service providers' offices will improve access to/provision of services because it eliminates the transportation barrier. Furthermore, because clients can often require encouragement to accept or receive services, this gives service providers greater capacity to followup or outreach to clients for services.

**Project 2: Creation of Homeless Youth Services:** The CoC's 10 Year Plan to End Homelessness includes the goal to, "Reduce the number of youth who become homeless upon discharge from the juvenile justice and foster care systems." Project 2 increased services for homeless youth. Specifically, homeless youth have access to financial and rental assistance to move into their own permanent housing. This is especially important in shortening the wait time for permanent housing assistance for youth who do not score high on the prioritized housing list. Wasn't sure whether these were new services or expanded services.

2. Describe how HEAP funds have contributed to your Continuum of Care making progress towards local youth homelessness goals (e.g. additional services provided, capacity created, systems building, investments made, lower waitlist, etc.)

The CoC's 10 Year Plan to End Homelessness includes the goal to, "Reduce the number of youth who become homeless upon discharge from the juvenile justice and foster care systems." The City of Bakersfield obligated HEAP Youth Set-Aside funds to the United Way of Kern County (UWKC) to manage expanded youth homelessness services. These services include rental deposit, application fees, credit check fees, and first month's rent for homeless youth. During the reporting period, the agency assisted homeless youth move into permanent housing. We expect a significant increase in the number of youth served by the COC during the three-year grant term. Again, not sure whether these are new or expanded services.

Bakersfield's shelter expansion is in construction and is expected to be complete by January 2021. Funds expended to date have been applied to architectural, design, and permit fees.
Project 2 experienced challenges in identifying affordable housing. However, project 2 continues to work with other partner agencies to indentify needed housing and the project will be complete by 6/30/2021
