#### **Section 5: Qualitative Assessment**

1. Describe how HEAP funds have contributed to your Continuum of Care making progress towards local homeless goals (e.g. additional services provided, capacity created, systems building, investments made, lower waitlists, etc.)

The HEAP award has significantly contributed to the local system of care and its goals and objectives. The City of Long Beach successfully acquired a site to operate as a navigation that will enhance outreach coordination, provide storage capacity for belongs of individuals residing on the streets and host ten (10) shelter beds for TAY youth. The site acquisition for the navigation center will also serve as the Winter Shelter site for Los Angeles County Service Planning Area 8. The Winter Shelter program will provide shelter capacity for a total of 125 adult singles experiencing shelter in Long Beach. The site underwent preliminary improvements to provide services for the Winter Shelter to operate December 1, 2019 through March 30, 2020. Once the shelter closes for the season, space enhancements will take place to allocate storage space and build out a permanent shelter space for TAY youth, including showers. The shelter will maintain a trauma informed and low barrier approach. The location is ideal for a TAY shelter as it sits in an inconspicuous part of town while still remaining accessible to major bus lines, metro and social service locations that will compliment the care coordination that will take place at the shelter. The navigation center will operate as a CES hub for street outreach operations and will coordinate closely with the Multi-Service Center which serves as the City's primary Coordinated Entry hub.

The City is also contracting with a local church to facilitate a Safe Parking program on their church lot which will provide 15 parking slots for people (families and singles) living in their vehicles. The goal of the safe parking program is to move individuals who are residing in their cars, off of the street and into safe parking spaces, while simultaneously connecting them to basic essential services and making the connection to social service programs to transition them into permanent housing. The City is working with the faith based partner to provide site improvements including lighting, proper fencing, striping and collocation of porta potties with washing stations in preparation for utilization of this site. HEAP funds will provide for the operational costs of the program.

The City is also embarking on a new work program to be operated by Pacific Gateway, Workforce Investment Network and supported by HEAP funds. The goal of the program is to engage both sheltered and unsheltered residents in steady, subsidized employment that provides them with base earnings and equips them with skills needed to secure competitive employment. Participants in the pilot will also be made available of competitive City employment opportunities, and be assisted in applying for available City jobs.

HEAP funding has allowed the City to make a concerted investment in preventing homelessness from growing in our community. Prior to HEAP funding, sources of prevention available in our community were limited to Emergency Solution Grant funds (which were capped at 30% of the total funded amount which is approximately \$140,000 per year) and Measure H funding which is limited to adult households only. Due to the limited funding availability, financial assistance is often depleted before end of contract year, leaving many households still in need. This funding has allowed the system to fill in gaps to serve TAY and Families who otherwise would become homeless.

2. Describe how HEAP funds have contributed to your Continuum of Care making progress towards local youth homelessness goals (e.g. additional services provided, capacity created, systems building, investments made, lower waitlist, etc.)

HEAP funding supports the CoC's efforts to enhance a comprehensive continuum of services for youth throughout LB by coordinating with providers to align programming therapeutic childcare/afterschool programming, youth development/resiliency practices, and educational assurances. Most recently, LB has initiated the development of a

Strategic Plan for Youth and Emerging Adults that will serve as the guiding vision and framework for responding to the needs of LB youth. The Youth Services Network (YSN) is a collaborative of stakeholders dedicated to the well-being of youth in LB through partnership, advocacy and resource sharing. Strategies for at-risk & youth experiencing homelessness include identifying gaps in services, wraparound supports, employment, educational supports, provision of TH, family strengthening strategies and reunification services. Long Beach is utilizing HEAP to increase shelter capacity for TAY populations via its Large City allocation by incorporating 10 TAY beds at the new navigation center. Further, CoC staff is a collaborative partner in the Department of Mental Health's Innovations II grant administered by Mental Health America which looks to increase community capacity for providing youth services for at-risk and homeless youth, increase employment pathways and utilizes a peer support model to achieve these program goals. The Everyone Home Long Beach supports the provision of new pathways to housing and prevention efforts including creating 240 job opportunities for homeless TAY. Pacific Gateway Workforce Investment Network (a City of Long Beach Department) will provide oversight of FutureLB, a youth specific workforce development center which will incorporate services & amenities for at-risk & homeless youth 16-25. Staffing at the center, slated to open in Spring 2020, will coordinate with TAY RRH programs to streamline housing placement. HEAP funds will be utilized to support programming at this site to link at-risk and homeless youth to employment, education and housing services.
